We want to send a big mahalo for all those yard sale donations, and special mahalo to our dedicated volunteers who worked hard to make each of the 4 yard sales very successful. Monies generated helps support spay/neuter, food and medication for the cats at PAWS, equipment, and other miscellanies.

My gratitude to Ms. Ellen Hocker for the life saving fence donation for the cats at PAWS. For years our rescued felines were attacked by vicious neighbors dogs and pig poachers loose dogs. Last year, Ms. Hocker donated fencing funds and 2 of the 20 acres around the main hub, was done by Andrew Fencing making it possible with their discount. Sadly, the neighbor's dogs again returned everyday patrolling along the unfenced sanctuary property hunting and killing any cats found resting or sleeping in the grass area.

The Hawaii Rainbow Ranges informed me they were not authorized to do anything and to call the police. The police, no matter how many times were alerted of the dogs on the sanctuary property, including pictures of the dead cats killed by the dogs, and multiple videos clearly identifying these dogs belong to the neighbor resulted in no action taken by the police.

Ms. Ellen Hocker an absolute angel, again donated additional funds and Andrew Fencing with another discount, enabled 10 of the 20 acres are now fence. For the first time since 2015, PAWS rescues are now safe from vicious dog attacks within the 10 of the 20 acres, and I can now leave the property for supplies without worrying for these precious fur kids' safety.

FYI – Our Vice-President who lives in Hilo, had a neighbor's dog attack and kill her cat on her property. Police were notified, and they never showed up. We have no County Humane Society, and we have no Animal Control enforcement as of this post.



An alert of Concern: A few animal organizations on our island hosting free spay and neuter feline clinics have used a veterinarian who does not do pregnant cats. That's their choice. The problem is they do not post, or forewarn customers, or make special spay accommodations with another Veterinarian at their cost who would. Feral cats coming in traps, suspected of being pregnant are given back to their caregivers to release unspayed into their colonies to have unwanted litters. Specifically, the purpose of using County S/N Grant Funds, is to decrease animal overpopulation humanely which includes pregnant ones. When securing your appointment Please ask: Does the Veterinarian for your clinic spay healthy pregnant cats? Once a cat has been trapped, it's difficult to re-trap for another Spay service. Unfortunately, people assume this is the same with other S/N organization, causing HPH to actively post that our clinics do service pregnant cats.

In May we were asked by the manager of the Grand Naniloa Hotel to spay and neuter the stray cats there. A donation of 500 per month to cover the S/N. (We are still owed monies, with only one payment received.) Every Tuesday Kay and I trapped late evening for Wednesday morning S/N by Dr. Kris at Good Karma Clinic, and cats returned on Thursday. A 3 day event of our time, and gas, but we were saving lives and that's what mattered. We successfully S/N and flea treatment their 20 cats. All went well until the TV show producer and staff came and we were asked to stop.







We want to thank everyone for all your generous donations. Without your donations we could not continue to S/N, PAWS Food, Medical cost, misc.

We are also very fortunate and humbled as recipients of a few grants allowing us to increase our spay/neuter funding. We are reaching out to help more during these difficult Pandemic times. The only proven effective solution to decrease animal overpopulation is spay/neuter.

Starting a horse therapeutic program is still on my wish list for PAWS. It will take dedicated and motivated individuals with the same vision to make it happen. If interested, please contact Frannie at 808 769-1128.
